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
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

jumped forward and said:

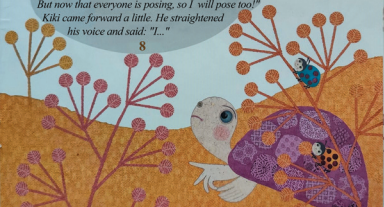
"What's the use of a beautiful tail

his voice and said: "I..."








Tigo laid down happily

Fafa laughed kindly and said: "Okay. By the way, I miss your noise."



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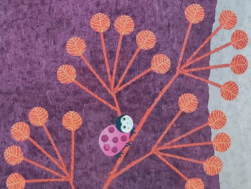



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Tigo looked at Fafa with surprise and asked sadly: "My noises? Am I making noise too?"
